Board Member Resolution for Initial Announcement

- A. Ms. García - Preserving Access to Safe Neighborhood Parks for our Future Generation
(Res-030-14/15) (For Action October 14, 2014, Regular Board Meeting, 1:00 p.m.)

Whereas, Parks and playgrounds make urban neighborhoods more livable, offer recreational opportunities for youth, and provide a sense of community;

Whereas, Access to schools, parks and recreational facilities has been strongly linked to reductions in crime, reduced juvenile delinquency, and improved health and academic performance;

Whereas, Every year, more than 70 million people visit parks in Los Angeles County including their neighborhood parks, and participate in park-sponsored recreational programs;

Whereas, Millions of children and youth use park facilities for after-school, weekend, and summer programs, and millions of seniors attend programs at nearby senior centers;

Whereas, LA County voters approved the Safe Neighborhood Parks Tax Measure in 1992, which generates about \$54 million a year for the acquisition, development, rehabilitation, protection and restoration of beach, wildlife, park and natural lands with the County, tree-planting, gang prevention and intervention, and improvement of recreation facilities for youth and senior citizens;

Whereas, The Safe Neighborhood Parks Tax Measure is set to expire and Proposition P, the Safe Neighborhoods and Gang Prevention, Youth/Senior Recreation, Beaches/Wildlife Protection Measure, is designed to continue to provide a voter-approved funding source to ensure all Los Angeles County parks and recreation centers that enhance our community are continuously serviced, maintained and upgraded, and that new parks and open space facilities are established;

Whereas, Proposition P would dedicate funds specifically for projects that increase parks, open space and recreational opportunities in underserved communities that have fewer parks and playgrounds and repair and upgrade neighborhood parks;

Whereas, Proposition P would allocate funds across the County, including projects that affect water quality; rivers, creeks, lakes and beaches; projects that relate to water supply sources; projects in park-poor areas; and projects that employ local youth;

Whereas, The purchase, construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of parks and recreation facilities under this measure will aid in the development of safe places and facilities for after-school, weekend and holiday programs for local children and youth, thereby creating healthy places for children and youth to play, learn and interact with other children; and

Whereas, These alternatives keep children and youth off the streets, providing positive incentives for healthy living; now therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Governing Board of the Los Angeles Unified School District supports the passage of Proposition P, the Safe Neighborhoods and Gang Prevention, Youth/Senior Recreation, Beaches/Wildlife Protection Measure to ensure all Los Angeles County parks and recreation centers that enhance our community are continuously serviced, maintained and upgraded, and that new parks and open space facilities are established for our students, families and community.
